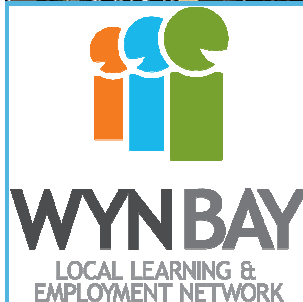

## What is a LLEN?

Local Learning and Employment Networks (LLENs) are a grouping or network of organizations and individuals interested and involved in education, training and employment, and in particular how these relate to young people in the age range 10-19 years. There are 31 LLENs across Victoria, established in 2001 and are incorporated associations and are legal entities in their own right. Wyn Bay LLEN covers the regions of Wyndham and Hobsons Bay

Wyn Bay LLEN is contracted to broker strategic, sustainable partnerships that support improved education and transition outcomes for young people, including increasing Year 12 or equivalent attainment rates. The core objective is to improve participation, engagement, attainment and transition outcomes for young people 10-19 years old within its geographic boundaries. LLENs also have a particular focus on those young people who are at risk of disengaging or who have already disengaged from education and training and are not in meaningful employment.

The partnerships established exist for the benefit of young people across all government, Catholic and other non-government education and training sectors including those experiencing high levels of disadvantage. The Wyn Bay LLEN broker sustainable partnerships between the following stakeholder groups:

- Education Providers
- Business and Industry
- Parents and Families
- Community groups.

Membership of a LLEN is open to any individual or organisation with an interest in education, training and employment in the area covered by the LLEN.

For education and training providers, joining a LLEN can help you to target your programs to real needs in the community.

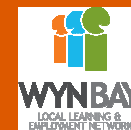
For agencies, joining a LLEN can help you to more effectively deliver your programs by working with employers and industry, and education and training providers, on program delivery and policy development.
